MINUTES

A meeting of the Environmental Protection Committee was held in the Meeting Room One, City Hall, 2580 Shaughnessy Street, Port Coquitlam, on Monday, July 17, 1989 at 4:45 p.m.

ITEM I: CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

The Co-Chairman requested that the minutes be held for adoption at the next meeting when the Chairman would be present.

ITEM II: DISCUSSION WITH S.H.A.R.E. RE: MULTI-MATERIAL CURBSIDE COLLECTION PILOT PROJECT

Derek Murphy introduced Roxann MacDonald who has taken over his responsibilities for S.H.A.R.E. now that he is leaving the organization. There was considerable discussion on the merits of pursuing a pilot project versus channelling the time and money required for this towards a full fledged program. With such developments as the completion of the McLaren Report for the GVRD and the possibility of funding from the Provincial Government towards start—up costs of a multi-material curbside program it was felt that there may not be a need for a pilot project. The Committee agreed that careful consideration should be given to what purpose a pilot project would serve before a decision is made to proceed.

It was pointed out that there is up to a six month delivery period for "blue boxes" due to the increasing demand; thus if the City wishes to carry out a pilot project prior to the expiry of IPI's current contract in July, 1990, the decision to proceed will have to be made soon.

ITEM III: PESTICIDE APPLICATION REGULATIONS

The Co-Chairman requested that further discussion on this item be deferred to the next Committee meeting when the Chairman would be present. It was suggested that the Deputy Engineer obtain further information from the City of Vancouver on the cost of the warning signs, where these are available, and any other relevant information prior to preparing a recommendation to Council.
