Item No. 2 Wheelchair Accessibility - Taxis



That the meetings be held the last Thursday of each month starting at 8:00am in the Parks and Recreation Office.



Recommendation:

That the City of Port Coquitlam implement a trial project of painting disabled parking spots blue with the white disabled symbol in the centre.

That this trial project be implemented in Parks and Recreation facility parking areas.

Background Information:

The issue of disabled parking "signage" has often been discussed by staff and members of the various Committees.

The issue has always been how we can clearly label a parking area for disabled use only in a manner that is easy to check whether someone is abusing the system.

The proposal is to paint disabled parking areas blue and place a disabled symbol in the middle. When a vehicle is parked in a space, the blue will still be visible around the car and would hopefully discourage people from parking illegally.

The cost of painting the stalls has been estimated at \$50.00 per stall.
