**Item No. 3          Chelsea Park - Opening**


A letter from resident of 1338 Halifax Avenue requesting that her daughter take part in the official opening of Chelsea Park, was reviewed by Committee.

It has been interesting watching the progress, since we moved into our house in Port Coquitlam on 30 May, 92.

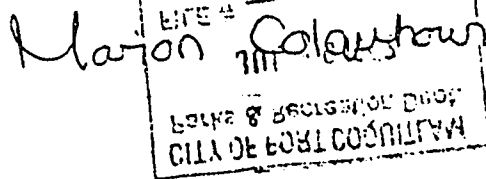

I would like your thoughts on the above. Thank You.

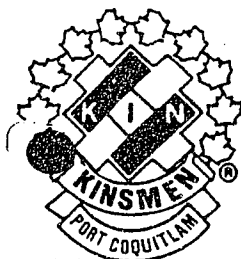


