Dear Mike:

Enclosed please find copies of letters received from the Park and Recreation Department, as well as a letter from Poco Saints Lacrosse Assn., dated Feb. 26, 1990, outlining our request for both Senior and Junior 'B' Lacrosse League and play-off games. Also enclosed, is the schedule of games and play-off dates for both teams.

The letter from the Parks and Recreation Department states we cannot use the old arena after August 5. To say the least, we are amazed ---- we really wonder if Port Coquitlam wants Junior and Senior Lacrosse out of the City.

At the meeting with the Parks and Recreation Department in February, I believe, Hugh Tait, Sally Hurst, Dave Parsons, Mary-Ann Parsons and myself, understood the old arena would be available for all games, including play-offs. Now according to the letter from the Parks and Recreation Dept. the old arena will not be available after August 5. Where are we to play our play-off games?

We are committed to our leagues, to have an arena to play in. It is quite impossible to get another arena at this time, as well as the fact, our Senior and Junior teams depend on the admission gate, concessions and 50/50 draw, as part of our operating expenses. It would be a great financial set-back for us if these games were cancelled because of arena availability, plus we would face fines by our leagues. Also, because we would be using a non resident arena, we would be faced with rental fees of \$75.00 per hour and higher, which we cannot afford. Port Coquitlam is the only City and/or Municipality where Senior and Junior Lacrosse have trouble with arena availability.

The Poco Saint's Junior 'B' are doing extremely well this year and we are anticipating going to Esquimalt in August for the Championship- 'The Founders Cup.'

We have also been entertaining thoughts of hosting the Founders Cup next year, but can hardly apply if the arena is not available.

The Poco Saint's Senior 'B' are just getting off the ground, but plans are already being made for a better and stronger team next year, as well as the possibility of hosting the play-offs in the future, The Presidents Cup.

Are we required to go through this hassle every year?

Are Lacrosse players not as important as the ice skaters? Many of our players feel they are being treated like second-class citizens.

We agreed at the meeting, to advise the Parks and Recreation Department if we do not make the play-offs and as soon as we no longer need the arena. Our Commissioners will advise us of our play-off games as soon as the last league game is played and we would then advise the Parks and Recreation Department. We cannot use the arena until April 18 and do not feel Lacrosse using the arena for 3 months is too much to expect. Your assistance in helping Senior and Junior 'B' Lacrosse in Port Coquitlam is very much needed and would be greatly appreciated. Should you wish to speak with the Commissioners, they are:

We are, needless to say, very upset and disturbed over the Parks and Recreation Department's letter and so are our players and parents, a majority of which, reside here in Port Coquitlam.


Attached is the Mayor's Message on behalf of the City of Port Coquitlam, wishing our teams the best ---- somehow, the words do not fit in with what is happening.

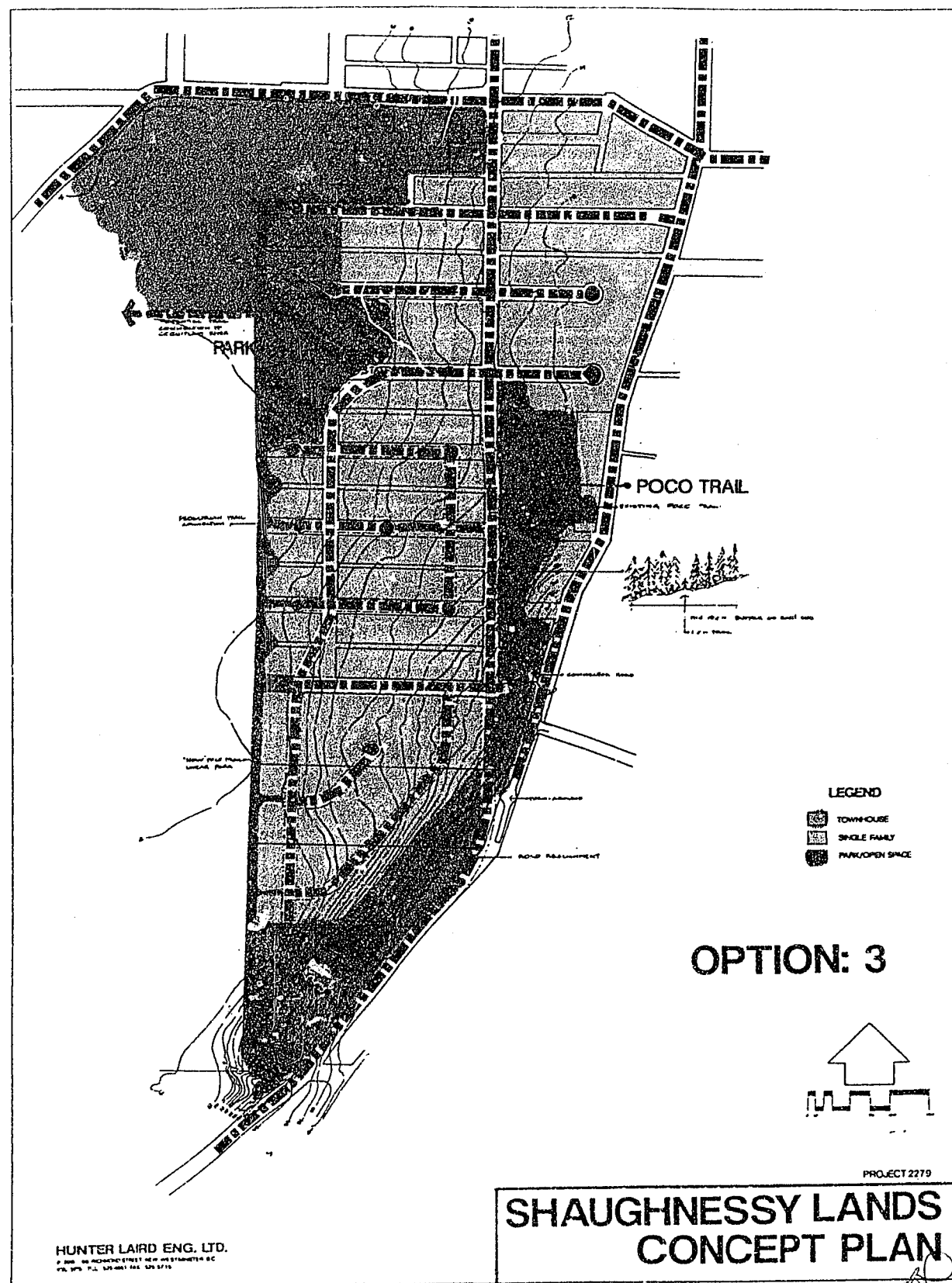
We would like some assurance, not just for this year, but future years, the old arena will be available for lacrosse.
