THE POCO MARLINS SENT A LETTER DATED OCTOBER 12, 1987 ABOUT OUR CONCERNS REGARDING CENTENNIAL POOL. WE UNDERSTAND YOU DID NOT RECEIVE THAT LETTER, AND AT YOUR REQUEST WILL PUT IN WRITING SOME OF THE AREAS OF CONCERN WE HAVE ABOUT CENTENNIAL POOL.


AS YOU ARE WELL AWARE CENTENNIAL POOL WAS BUILT IN 1957 ALONG WITH MANY OTHER CENTENNIAL POOLS AND IS ONE OF THE LAST STILL IN USE. EVERYTHING HAS A LIFE EXPECTANCY, AND AFTER 30 YEARS OF USE THIS FACILITY HAS SERVED ITS PURPOSE. MAINTENANCE STAFF DO THEIR UTMOST TO FRESENT THE FACILITY AT ITS BEST, BUT BECAUSE OF THE AGE OF THE FACILITY, AND BECAUSE IT SEEMS TO HAVE A LOW PRIORITY WHEN IT COMES TO THE PURSE STRINGS, CENTENNIAL POOL HAS BECOME RUNDOWN AND IS IN A STATE OF CONSTANT DISREPAIR. IT IS THE OPINION OF THE MARLINS AND THE FACT THAT IT IS ONE OF THE LAST REMAINING CENTENNIAL POOLS IN USE, THE FOINT OF REPAIR HAS LONG SINCE PASSED AND IT NEEDS TO BE REPLACED.

WE REALIZE THAT 1980 WILL BE A STATUS-QUO YEAR FOR PARKS AND REC. SO WE ARE ASKING THAT YOU CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING AREAS OF IMMEDIATE CONCERN IN YOUR 1980 SUDGET;

1/ WASHROOMS: GENERAL UPGRADING OF THE WASHROOMS, NEW TOILETS AND DISPENCERS

2/ FENCING: THE WHOLE PERIMETER FENCE AND GATES NEED REPLACING INCLUDING AND ESPECIALLY THE BARBED WIRE.

3/ POOL DECK: THE POOL DECK IS BECOMING EVER INCREASINGLY UNEVEN ALLOWING THE POSSIBILITY OF TRIPPING AND INJURY TO INDIVIDUALS.



THE ABOVE CONCERNS HAVE BEEN REQUESTED FOR SEVERAL YEARS BY THE MARLINS AND HOPE THAT CENTENNIAL POOL WILL BE GIVEN A HIGHER PRIORITY THAN IT HAS HAD IN PREVIOUS YEARS. WE FEEL WE HAVE KEPT OUR CONCERNS TO A MINIMUM AND HOPE THIS WILL ASSIST YOU IN RECTIFYING THE PROBLEMS AND REMAIN,





### PURPOSE/PROBLEM:

To review the Port Coquitlam Amateur Athletic Association's request for free use of the Wilson Centre Auditorium and Mabbett Room and to prepare a recommendation for the consideration of the Parks and Recreation Committee.

### HISTORY/BACKGROUND:

The P.C.A.A.A. have scheduled the Queens Tea for February 10th, 1988 in the Wilson Centre Auditorium. The All Sports Queen Ball is scheduled for February 13th, 1988 in the Mabbett Room. The City has waived the fees for these events in the past.

The P.C.A.A.A. is also making an effort to run a break even event in 1988.

### ALTERNATIVES:

There are three or four basic alternatives available for consideration:

- 1) We can approve P.C.A.A.A.'s request for free use of the identified facilities.
- 2) We can refuse the P.C.A.A.A.'s request for free use of the identified facilities.
- 3) We can suggest some alternatives, such as a reduced rental fee.
- 4) We can approve P.C.A.A.A.'s request for free use of the identified facilities but forewarn them that this is not an ongoing annual committment.

### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

Waiving the rental fees for this event, results in a possible loss of revenues of approximately \$350.00. In addition, we would have to absorb all cost related to operating and cleaning the facilities.

It is recommended that the Parks and Recreation Committee approved the request received from the P.C.A.A.A. for the free use of the Wilson Centre auditorium on February 10, 1988 and the Mabbett Room on February 13, 1988 for the Queens Tea and the All Sports Queen Ball, respectively. And that the P.C.A.A.A. be made aware that this practice of waiving fees for these kinds of functions is being reviewed and may be discontinued in the

### RECOMMENDATION:

On February 10, 1988, the P.C.A.A.A. is holding the Queens Tea at the Wilson Centre. On February 13, 1988, they are hosting the All Sports Queen Ball in the Mabbett Room. As in the past, they would like the facility rental charges waived. Since the budget for these events has already been established, the P.C.A.A.A. would be very critical of the City if we now charged them rent, without having forewarned them.

### CONCLUSION/SUMMARY:

In an effort to decrease the reliance on the tax base, the Parks and Recreation Committee has been changing its practice with regards to free use of facilities. Should rental fees for these events ever be introduced, it would likely only effect the Queen's Ball. The Queen's Tea is put on at the Wilson Centre as a fundraiser for the Silver Chord Choir.

### OTHER:

The P.C.A.A.A. have already established a budget for this event. Since the past precedence has been for the City to waive all rental fees, they have not included rental fees in the budget. Therefore, it is anticipated that the P.C.A.A.A. would be frustrated and upset with the City for changing a precedence without forewarning them.
