SUBJECT: Kinsmen Auction -

Request to Waive Hyde Creek Rental Fee

Purpose/Problem:

To review the Kinsmen's request for free use of Hyde Creek on November 27th, 1937 for their fund raising auction and prepare a recommendation for the consideration of the Parks & Recreation Committee.

History/Background:

On November 27th, 1987 the Kinsmen are planning to hold an auction at Hyde Creek. They are also interested in selling food, wine and beer in the lounge area. All proceeds from this event will be contributed towards the Kinsmen's Water Park project at Sun Valley Park.

Alternatives:

There are three basic alternatives:

- 1. We can approve the Kinsmen's request for free use of the Hyde Creek Recreation Center facilities.
- 2. We can refuse the Kinsmen's request for free use of Hyde Creek Recreation Center facilities.
- 3. We can suggest some alternative, such as a reduced rental fee.

Financial Implications:

Waiving of the rental fees for this event, results in a possible loss of revenues in the neighborhood of \$1,000.00. In addition we would have to absorb all costs related to operating and cleaning up the facility, including staff for most of a day.

Citizens/Public Relations Involvement/Implications:

It is unlikely that the citizens of Port Coquitlam would object to the waiving of fees for this event. Proceeds from this event will be used for a project that will positively impact the quality of life in this community.

Other:

The Kinsmen would also like to use the upstairs lounge area and the outside patio for the sale of food and beverage. In addition, the Kinsmen will need to utilize various pieces of equipment, (i.e. tables, chairs, stage, etc.).

I believe the Kinsmen would be willing to assist with clean-up, (i.e. washing table tops, picking up major garbage, etc.) which would help reduce the impact of not charging a rental fee for this event.

Conclusion/Summary:

On November 27th, 1987 the Kinsmen are hosting an auction at Hyde Creek Center. Proceeds for the event will be credited to the construction of the water park at Sun Valley. To ensure that the Kinsmen are able to maximize the revenues generated for this worthy project, they have asked the City to waive all rental fees. The Kinsmen would also like permission to serve food and beverages, (including beer and wine), in the upstairs lounge area.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Kinsmen;

- Be given free rent of Hyde Creek for the purpose of holding an auction on November 27th, 1987.
- Be allowed to sell and serve food and beverages, (including beer and wine), in the upstairs lounge area and outside patio.
- Be requested to help with clean-up, (i.e. washing table tops, picking up garbage, etc.)
