
Item No. 1      Wilson Centre Expansion

With reference to your May 9th, 1986 memorandum concerning the above noted subject this will advise that when the same was placed before a regular Council Committee meeting held on May 26th, 1986 the following resolution was passed:

- "1. That the Wilson Centre Advisory Board remain intact and that Council re-affirm the Wilson Centre Advisory Board Constitution.
2. That the request for office space by the O.A.P.O., in the Wilson Centre Expansion, be turned down.
3. That the existing storage space provided to the O.A.P.O., in the Wilson Centre, be continued in the proposed expansion.
4. That the O.A.P.O. be permitted to continue to hold their monthly meetings in the Wilson Centre."

All Council members were present at the Committee Meeting and there were no dissenting votes.
