CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

Item No. 1 Can-Pac

The Committee discussed the presentation from Can-Pac Energy Consultants and wished to take the report to Council and invite Can-Pac to attend the next Council meeting with a presentation.

Recommendation

- That Can-Pac Energy Consultants be invited to appear before the next Council meeting to make a ten minute presentation.
- That the Parks & Recreation Department enter into a contract with Can-Pac Energy Consultants to install their system under their 75/25 sharing plan.

Item No. 2 Letter to Mrs. Vernon

Mrs. Vernon wrote the department a letter in which she complained about the registration in aquatics and also complained about the fact that we did not have enough facilities in our community.

That a letter be sent to Mrs. Vernon indicating that we are hopefully going to enter into a feasibility study of the Hyde Creek Centre to find out whether our facilities are adequate.

Item No. 3 Letter from Amos & Judy Poel

The Committee discussed the piece of property that Mr. & Mrs. Poel indicated they would sell to the City if we were interested in a park in this area. Janna Taylor indicated that we do, indeed, need parkland in this particular area; however, it was felt that, at this time, the parkland in question should be left until they sold their properties and that when a plan for houses for this area is presented to the City, the 5% parkland be part of the requirement for the sub-division. The Committee also discussed the aspect of having a waterfront park south of the Mary Hill By-Pass area. It was agreed that this should be looked at at a later date.

Recommendation

That a letter be sent to Amos and Judy Poel that the Committee is not interested at this time in their piece of property.

Item No. 4 Feasibility Study

The Committee was presented with Terms of Reference for a feasibility study of Wilson Centre and Hyde Creek Centre. Janna Taylor requested that the aldermen take some time to look over this reference material and come back with recommendations for additions or deletions.

Item No. 5 Aquatics

It was discussed that many residents have been bringing their concerns to the various aldermen regarding inadequate aquafits at the outdoor pools during the summer months. Janna Taylor indicated that over the past years, it has been generally agreed that the summer aquatics would be dedicated to the use of Port Coquitlam youth. It should also be noted that the swim team has a large amount of time at both Centennial and Robert Centennial Pool, two at noon hour, one after work on Monday and one after work on Friday. It was generally agreed that the concern in regard to aquafit would be fully looked at for the next summer period.



SUBJECT:

Feasibility Study - Wilson Centre & Hyde

Creek Centre - Terms of Reference

The Port Coquitlam Parks & Recreation Department have identified the three areas that require feasibility studies in the following year. The areas identified are the present Wilson Centre, Hyde Creek Indoor Pool and the Reeve Street Park Area.

Wilson Centre -

The original centre was opened in 1975 and was expanded in 1979. The square footage of the centre is approximately 3500 square feet. It presently has one large meeting area which has a dividing wall, a crafts room with a divider, a pool room, small meeting room, kitchen, office and storage area.

The Parks & Recreation Department wishes to have a feasibility study on the above centre. Terms of reference:

- Work in conjunction with the Wilson Centre Advisory Committee
- Identify if there is a need for expansion

If expansion is required, the following information is needed:

- i) Facilities required
- ii) Size of facilities
- iii) Locations of facilities
- iv) Estimated cost of expansion in 1985 and 1986 dollars
- Should it be a multi use facility or separate facility for those 50 and over.

vi) Type of programming requirements in the next five to ten years.

Hyde Creek Recreation Centre -

The centre was opened in 1975 and contains an indoor swimming pool. The pool is 25 meters with six lanes. It has a one meter diving board. The Parks & Recreation Department wishes to have a feasibility study on the above pool to determine the projected needs of the community in terms of an indoor pool. Terms of reference:

- 1. Who is using the pool?
 - a) Who is Hyde Creek's present target group
 - b) Who is Hyde Creek's potential target group
 - c) Who goes there
 - d) Age of participants
 - e) Sex of participants
 - f) Frequency of usage
- 2. Current population trends
- 3. If expansion is required, please identify.
 - a) What facilities are needed
 - b) Size of facilities
 - c) Cost of expansion of facilities
- 4. Work in conjunction with the aquatic staff and maintenance staff.
