CRITERIA FOR THE AWARDING OF THE

CITY OF PORT COQUITLAM CIVIC AWARDS

GENERAL

- 1. The recipient must be or must have been a resident of Port Coquitlam for at least six months prior to the nomination for the award.
- 2. No person or group of persons shall receive the award more than once for each specific award class.
- 3. Any person may nominate an individual or group of individuals by completing a nomination form, returning it to the City Clerk who will present it to the Council.
- 4. A majority vote of Council is required to authorize presentation of an award except for "Recognition" when approval of the Mayor will suffice.
- 5. An award or awards will not necessarily be awarded each year.

SPORTS

May be awarded to an individual or team who wins a competition at the highest Provincial level or for equivalent achievement.

ARTS & SCIENCES

May be awarded to an individual or group of individuals who achieves the highest Provincial level or equivalent recognition for a work of art, performance, composition, scientific achievement or similar work.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

May be swarded to an individual or group of individuals who performs an outstanding service to the City, the Province, or Canada, or who, over a period of years served the City, the Province, or Canada in an outstanding manner.

EEROISM

May be awarded to an individual or group of individuals who show outstanding heroism in the protection of life and/or property.

RECOGNITION

May be awarded to recognize Wedding Anniversaries, Birthdays, or other personal milestones reached by City residents; or, if applicable, by clubs or organizations.

Memorandum To: His Worship the Mayor and Council of all B.C. Municipalities
Establishment of Regional/Mayors Award Committees
in British Columbia

You will recall that in the summer of 1982 the full Executive of UBCM saw fit to give unanimous support to (a) the ideals of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award programme for youth and (b) the establishment of Standing Committees for continuing local Award representation to be known as the Mayors Award Committee and, in some eight Municipalities, a Regional Awards Committee.

Since September of last year 1 Regional Committee has been established, in Prince George, 7 Mayors Committees established in other municipalities, initiated in a further 12 and a strong commitment to early initiation has been received from a further 18 communities.

In addition to the stated aims, as in the attached, the Mayor Award Committee has been described as an enhancement of credibility of the Municipal Government through alignment with this apolitical but prestigious international challenge programme.

In light of the above, the following is offered as a practical approach for the establishing of your Awards Committee:

- 1) The Mayor, or one of his Aldermen, after discussion, will make the Mayor's Committee before Council in the form of a motion.
- A Chairman is selected most likely the Mayor or an Alderman.
 A Secretary is appointed the most suitable candidate is usually the Recreation Director for the Community.
- 4) Using the proposed membership in the Memorandum on this subject, copy attached, and with regard to the Municipal Services Directory letters are sent from the Chairman inviting membership. (with a copy of Award information material) with a request;
 - a) to attend a general familiarization meeting at a convenient time and date, probably to be held in the Council chamber.
 - b) to allow their names and organizations to be gazetted as being in support to the Award and the Mayor's Committee.
 - c) Where applicable, the Secretary to be informed as to resource availability, ie., adults in a leadership or assessor role pertinent to a special field of activity.
 - d) Unless otherwise desired the Committee would be invited to meet, perhaps twice a year, on one occasion to allow members to discuss Award development in the Municipality and on the other, certainly, to attend on the Mayor and Council when Award certificates and pins are presented on behalf of the Lieutenant-Governor and the Patron.

It is a pleasure to advise that resulting from a letter sent to MLA's and M.P.'s, many replies have expressed support to the Award and a willingness to serve as a member on a Mayors or Regional Awards Committee.

On behalf of the B.C. & Yukon Council, may I request, if you haven't done so already, that you give early favourable consideration and action to establish a Mayors Awards Committee for your municipality

Your support, in this matter, is very much appreciated.



DRITISH COLUMBIA & YUKON REGIONAL AWARDS COMMITTEE

AIM

It is intended to establish eight regionally located Awards Committees, to decentralize administration of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award across

- 1. improve communications
- 2. increase regional contacts
- 3. reduce costs to the Division office
- 4. expand the programme based on aims stated for the Mayor's Award Committee.

OPERATION

- 1. The Committee, with support from the Office of the Mayor, shall constitute an Executive Secretary (appendix A) (the regional director) a Chairman (appointed from other members of the committee) a Vice-Chairman, a Treasurer; and, other officers as deemed appropriate.
- 2. Meetings shall be convened once a month and minutes kept of proceeding
- 3. The composition of the committee shall be:
 - -- Reps from Mavor's Committee in the region
 - Service Club reps (Lions, Rotary, Big Brothers, etc.)
 - Cadets, Scouts/Guides, YMCA, 4H reps, etc.
 - ... Education reps
 - RCMP reps - Media reps
- 4. Pinancially the committee shall receive support from the B.C. & Yukom Council, but shall aim to be self-supporting. All fund drives shall, however, be subject to the Council's approval.
- 5. Membership expansion, the establishment of a newsletter, and, the conve · · tinued liaison with groups, individuals and volunteers, will remain top priorities for the committee(s).

DEVELOPMENT

- The committee, which is the Mayor's Award Committee at region level. shall establish a cadre of personnel committed to the programme from whom volunteers, assessors etc., can be drawn.
- 2. The committee shall establish links with previous Gold Award recipients and the Provincial G.A.S.
- The committee shall compile, update and modify a list of school boards, superintendents, principals and schools within its
- The committee shall establish links with the various media, newspaper,
- 5. The committee shall maintain contacts with various service clubs, service organizations, volunteer groups, R.C.M.P., youth groups etc.
- 6. The committee shall be committed to the notion of credibility for the programme developing initial contacts with interested personnel and thereafter maintaining those contacts with up-dated information literature, recent directives from both the national and provincial offices, and, generally in the facilitation of resources to ensure smooth operation of the programme.

BRITISH COLUMBIA & YUXON MAYOR'S AWARD COMMITTEE

AIM

It is intended to establish a Mavor's Award Committee in all Municipalities other than those with a Regional Award's Committee. To assist in the organization and administration of the Duke of Edinburch's Award programme across B.C. & Yukon, in conjunction with the Division Director.

Specific aims are:

- 1) to be a focus for adult Award awareness and promotion, to heighten the value of the Award in the community.
- 2) to be a resource pool for adult leaders and assessors and to provide support for the maintainence of Award Standards, and
- 3) to provide support to the Mayor when he makes presentations locally on behalf of His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor at Bronse and/or Silver level.

OPERATION

- The committee shall constitute an Executive Secretary, a Chairman (either the Mavor or one of his/her elected Aldermen as appointed), a Vice-Chairman, a Treasurer and other officers as deemed appropriate.
- Meetings shall be convened two/three times a year and minutes 'kept of proceedings.
- 3. The composition of the committee shall be: - all those interested in the Award
 - where possible include teachers, educators, service club reps, media reps, community recreation director(s), R.C.M.P. personnel, voluntary organization reps, Guide - Scout reps etc. G.A.S. reps.
