While up here I have been going into the chemical end of our business and it is in connection with this that I have taken the liberty of writing this letter. What I am anxious to know is just what is involved in making a complete analysis or even partial analysis of ordinary limestone. That is I would like to know if the equipment necessary to do this is very extensive and also whether the analysis is a difficult one to make.
