Protection

- (1) - on the march = duties of advance flank - rear guards - distance from main body formations -
- (2) - at Rest = (of extreme importance) Outposts, disposition of, ability to actually choose position for and place the outposts to defend a given section of ground (practical) -
- use of artillery with outposts - machine guns - reserves - distance from main body - patrols - relieving hour - instructions for outposts -
