My dear Friends:

Let us not forget in our own personal happiness that there are those who cannot share it. To them we can say "Happy Christmas" for from Christ we have learned that in Him there is neither far nor near but one eternal presence. Our beloved departed simply keep Christmas in another sphere of life. As a young Air Force officer said "We don't think of John as dead. He has been posted to another Command."

You will find the list of Christmas services elsewhere, but I want to remind you of the Carol Service next Sunday evening, which will be Christmas Eve. We shall also have the usual midgnight service, beginning at 11:15 p.m. Archbishop dePencier will celebrate at the 8 a.m. and our own Bishop at the 11 a.m. communions. Although I have not seen the necessity of it, I still like to remind you of the solemn nature of communion, and to ask that there be nothing casual or unprepared in your Christmas communion, especially the Midnight Service.

I once promised two little friends of mine in Calgary that I had ordered snow for Christmas. The result was practically a nervous breakdown on the part of the children, the parents and myself. Nevertheless, the snow came in time, to the relief of all concerned. What I am leading up to is that I have ordered fine weather for Christmas. I leave it to you to decide just what "fine weather" is in Vancouver in December. Not fog, anyhow.
