An Act to ammend the Food and Drugs Act.

His Majesty, bu and with the advice and consent of the Senate and the House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:-

Regulations. 1. Paragraph (g) of subsection one of section three of the Food and Drugs Act, chapter seventy-six, of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1927, is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:-

To allow being members of the staff of the Department to be designated Dominion Analysts

"(g) For designating as Dominion Anaanalysts, not lyst any member of the technical staff appointed to the services of the Department of Pensions and National Health or, upon the request of any province, city or other municipality. any duly qualified analyst then and for such time as the said analyst shall remain so employed by the said province, city or other municipality.

Explanatory Note. The paragraph to be repealed and reenacted reads as follows:-

"(g) for designating as Dominion Analyst any member of the technical staff already appointed to the services of the department of Health
