Received from Sergt J. Tripps, of Royal Canadian Mounted Police, at 12⁰⁰ noon, Saturday June 25/27.

2- Round bottles, containing liquid for analysis, as to alcoholic content, etc., (alleged alcohol)

Case of "Eugene Valente, 85-1 Keefer St.

The 2 bottles are Round bottles, (16 oz. size, or Reputed Pints) each bottle contains 15 ozs, of liquid in each, and the bottles are numbered '1' & '2'.

The liquid in each of these bottles, is of a faintly yellowish tinge and has a brown sediment in the bottom of each bottle, which when it is mixed through the liquid hangs in suspension in small brown particles.

The liquid in each of these bottles appears to be a "Potable or grain alcohol", from appearance, smell, and taste. It smells somewhat similar to Scotch Whisky, and the taste is also somewhat similar.

Gun label on each bottle, written on each label is: "Sample from tin of Alcohol, seized May 23rd 1927, by Sergt Tripps at 85-1 Keefer St., Vancouver, B.C., the residence of

Eugene Valente, F.H., - J.F., - H.W.R." - 24-6-27"

(The above is written on each bottle, except that the number changes to '1' & '2'. (The letter "H", written in ink, on top of plaster of Paris, on each bottle.)

Plain cork in each bottle, which has a thin coating of Plaster of Paris over each cork, and each one is tied down with a piece of string.

also sealing wax on side of neck of each bottle, which partly touch cork in each bottle, but each cork can be lifted out without disturbing the wax.

stamped in the wax is: "R. N. W. M. Police, Canada," with also a 'Crown' insignia stamped in it.
